Respondents reported various types of experiences they would like to receive as wed-

• 19%: Getaways like luxurious hotel stays or weekend staycations.

Despite the rising popularity of experiential gifts, cash remains a favored option, with nearly 35% of respondents preferring it as a wedding gift. However, wedding gift budgets have not kept pace with inflation. About a third of respondents indicated they spend between \$50 and \$100 on a wedding present, while another 30% keep their spending under \$150.

Zola recommends organizing

a gift registry by price point to allow options for people with different budgets. They further recommend that you have at least one registry item for every guest you are inviting, keeping in mind that some people may pool their funds to gift a higher-ticket item.

"Our expectations of guests are quite high and can be extremely costly, and sometimes people can't always afford the same things we can," said Alyssa Davies, a personal financial writer. "As long as you

have a range of prices, there can be a way to make everyone feel as though they're able to support you on your new adventure as a married couple."

Registries remain relevant, with 46% of respondents stating they always purchase from a couple's registry if one is available.

In addition to Tinggly, other places that offer experiences on their registries include Honeyfund, The Knot Registry Store, Zola and Honeymoon Fund.
